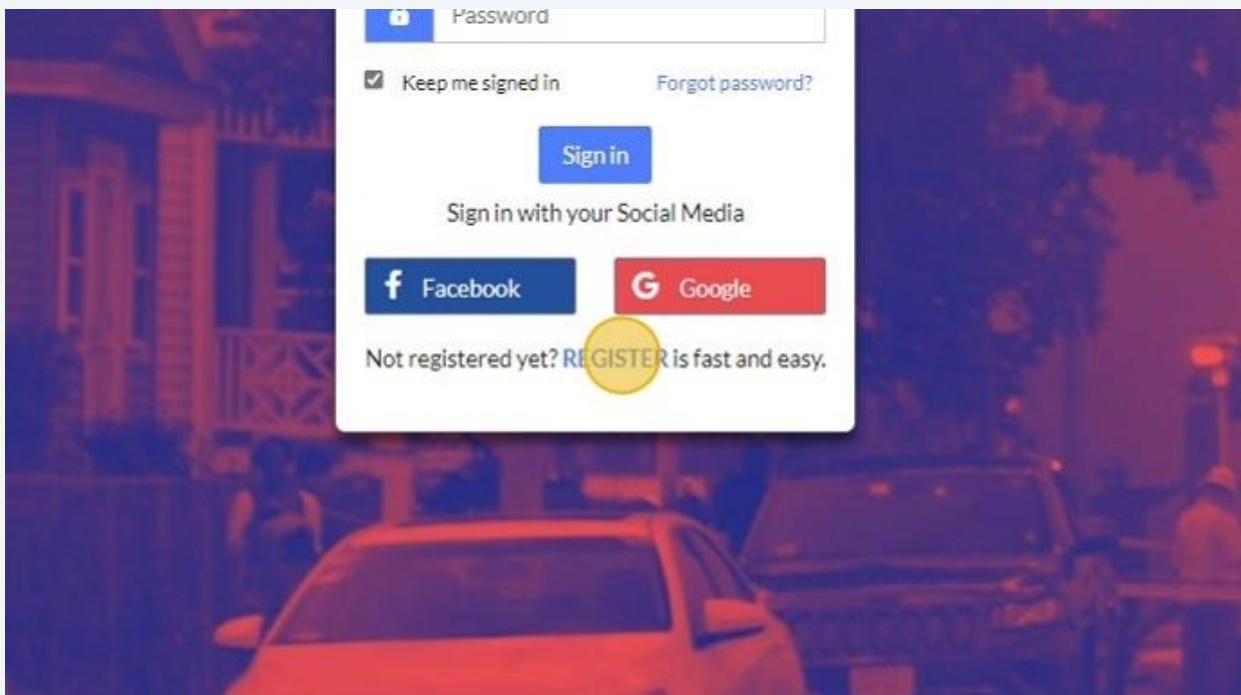


# Create Community Connect Account and Request Burn Permit



2 Click on "Register" to create new account.




3 Enter your email, create, and confirm your password.

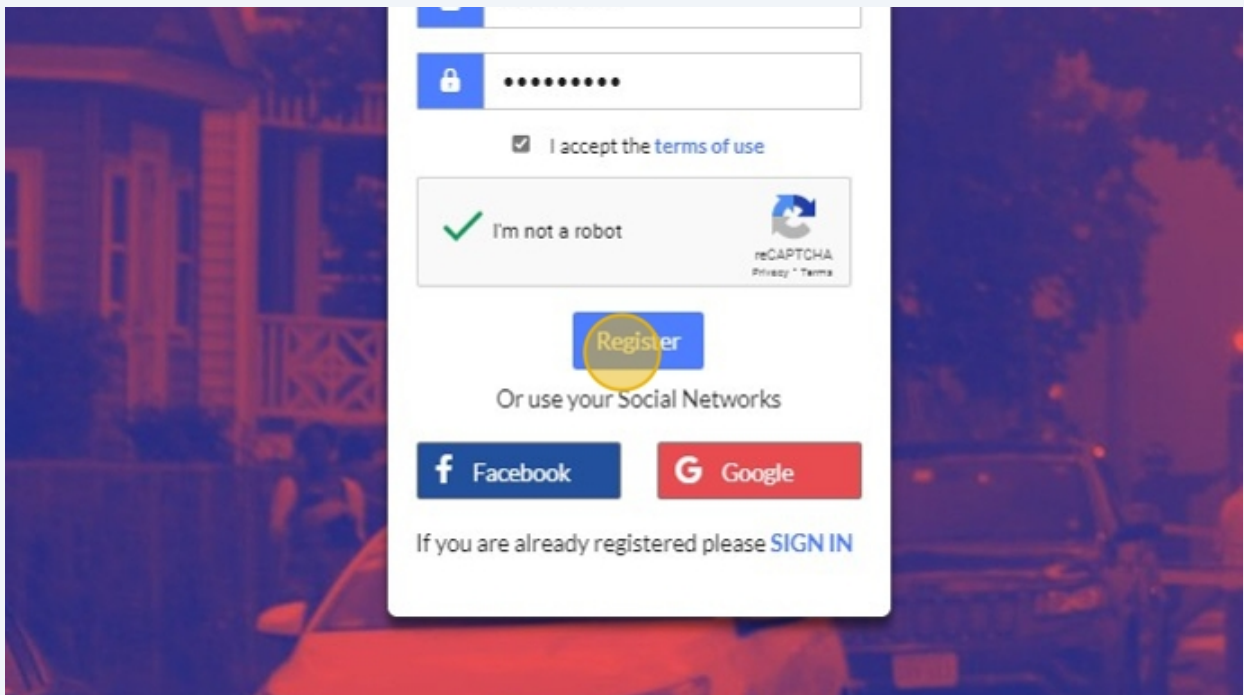





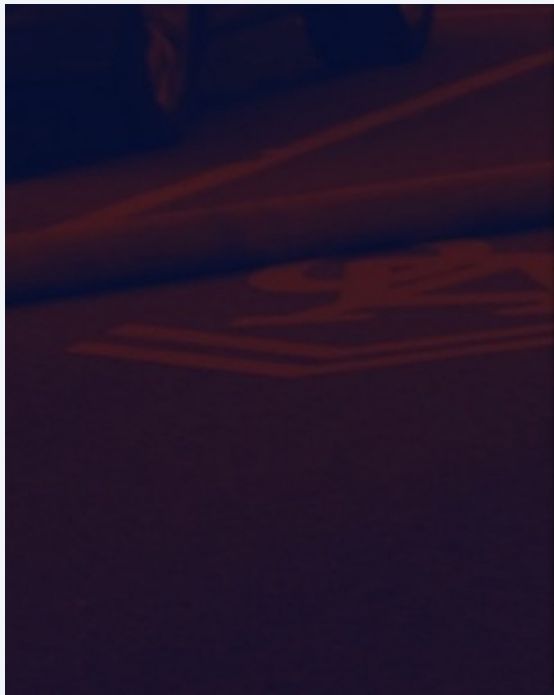

**RESIDENTIAL BURN PERMIT RULES & REGULATIONS**

This permit is valid for the burning of natural vegetation only and subject to the rules and regulations of Washington State, Pierce County, and the Fire District issuing the permit (RCW 70.34.051-054, WAC 307 WAC 173-425). Failure to comply with these rules and regulations may result in the forfeiture of the permit and/or financial restitution to the Fire District for actions taken by the District to mitigate the permittee's failure to follow these regulations and rules.

- Burning is prohibited June 1st through September 30th.
- This permit applies to the address listed on the permit and for a single burn pile.
- A human dwelling must be present on the property.
- The permittee must have legal authority to burn on the listed property.
- This permit may be revoked at any time if a complaint is received regarding nuisance smoke or ash leaving the property.

**BURN GUIDELINES**

- Burning must be done during daylight hours.
- Burn pile must be at least 50 feet from any structure and no larger than four (4) feet in diameter and four (4) feet in height.
- Burn pile may not be placed under trees or powerlines.
- The permit authorizes the burning of dry, natural vegetation that originates on or is immediately adjacent to the human dwelling.
- Combustibles must be cleaned to expose mineral soil around the burn pile before a fire is ignited.
- Conditions that could allow the fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure must be eliminated before the fire is ignited.
- A competent person must constantly attend to open fires until the fire is extinguished.
- A method for extinguishing the fire, such as a garden hose connected to a water supply, must be readily accessible while the fire is burning.

It is illegal to burn any prohibited materials including: garbage, dead animals, cardboard, paper, building materials, asphalt, petroleum products, paints, rubber, plastic, or any other substance which normally emits dense smoke or obnoxious odors.
